Programs

Programs will be available @ Music Plus in the Trinity Conception Mall in Carbonear approximately one week prior to the Festival for \$5.00. They will also be available at all venues during the Festival.

Objectives of the Festival

- 1. To stimulate in the citizens of Trinity-Conception-Placentia Bays a greater appreciation and understanding of music.
- 2. To discover and encourage musical talents in those of all ages.
- 3. To make available to those who compete, the constructive criticism of musicians who are outstanding in their profession and who have the experience of competitive festivals to bring to this area.
- 4. To so enthuse those whose talents justify it, that they may ultimately enter the profession of music as performers or teachers and so direct and forward the training or stimulate the progress and development of others.
- 5. Through cash awards, to give some assistance to those who desire to progress in their knowledge of music and in their ability to perform or teach it.
- 6. To stimulate interest in choral and instrumental groups, such as church and other choirs, bands, orchestras and smaller ensembles.
- 7. Through music, to bring greater joy and happiness to our land.

Notes for the Guidance of Participants in the 2022 - 50th Anniversary Festival

- 2. The site of the festival will be in Carbonear.
- 3. Any information required regarding this Music Festival can be obtained by contacting Ms. Ann Coombs, 596-1514 or 589-5963 (cell).
- 4. Address for picking up Quick Study pieces:2 Pike's Lane, Carbonear (available 48 hours in advance of class).
- 5. Dates of the Festival will be, tentatively, <u>March 26th April 1st 2022</u>. Festival Grand Concerts will be April 5th , April 6th and April 7th 2022.
- 6. The list of trophies, plaques and cash awards will be announced later.
- 7. Please Note: <u>The Committee will not be responsible for providing accompanists</u> for participants in the 2022 festival. As there are <u>multiple</u> venues for this Festival, it is imperative the Accompanist Profile on the Registration Screen is completed so scheduling can accommodate those accompanists **if possible**.
- 8. Please Note: The Committee will not be responsible for arranging for Music Stands or Music Instruments. Music Teachers will need to make their own arrangements for these.
- 9. Entries must be completed by music teachers or parents of entrants under the age of 18. Payments will only be on-line through **credit card or Paypal accounts.**
- 10. Deadline for entries is no later than **November 15th**, **2021**.

Procedures, Rules and Regulations - ROSE BOWL AWARDS

All participants for the Senior Rose Bowl and Junior Rose Bowl will be required to announce their name and the pieces they are going to perform. This will aid the adjudication process and help to build confidence for those who intend to further their musical interests. To provide a more balanced concert at the Rose Bowl Competition, a minimum of 6 minutes and a maximum of 10 minutes performance time will be allowed. A penalty may be incurred if limit is exceeded.

In ALL Concert Groups that qualify for the Senior and Junior Rose Bowl, memory is compulsory.

Kiwanis Club of Carbonear Senior Rose Bowl

At the conclusion of the competitive sessions, the adjudicator **may** recommend one competitor from each of the following three solo classes, who in their opinion, gave the best performance in that particular class:

- (a) PIANO CONCERT GROUP SENIOR CLASS 30010
- (b) VOCAL CONCERT GROUP SENIOR CLASS 20010
- (c) INSTRUMENTAL CONCERT GROUP SENIOR- CLASS 50010

The three selected will enter further competition in a special "Rose Bowl Competition" to be held at the end of the Festival. The winner will receive the Kiwanis Club of Carbonear Rose Bowl and a cash award of \$500.00. The two runners-up will each receive cash awards of \$150.00 and an inscribed shield.

In order to qualify for this award, competitors must receive a mark in the competitive sessions of **85% or better**.

In order to be recommended for the Rose Bowl Competition, competitors must be between the ages of 16 and 18 on December 31 of the year prior to the Festival.

Previous Rose Bowl winners will not be eligible to compete in the Rose Bowl Competition from the same concert group. If, however, a previous winner qualifies from another category, he or she will be eligible for the second time.

A competitor may enter the Rose Bowl competition in **one** area only in any given year. If recommended from two or more areas, the competitor must choose the area in which he/she will compete and the other category will be filled by the next eligible competitor, if recommended.

Note 1: Performers in the Senior Rose Bowl Classes may be recommended for the Provincial Festival at the discretion of the Adjudicator as long as the criteria for Provincials are met by the selections chosen. Regulations for the Provincial Competition are found in the National Syllabus found on our website.

Kiwanis Club of Carbonear Junior Rose Bowl

Junior Concert Group: Class 20020, Class 30020 and Class 50020 will be eligible. If no one is eligible from Classes 20020, 30020 or 50020, the adjudicator can recommend a participant from Classes 20030, 30030 or 50030. Rules and regulations will be the same as those for Senior Rose Bowl competition, with the following exceptions:

- age limit (13-15)
- cash awards
- a participant is eligible to compete for the Junior Rose Bowl again, in the same category, after being ineligible for one year after winning it.

The winner will receive a Junior Rose Bowl and a cash award of \$300. The runners-up will each receive a cash award of \$75 and an inscribed shield.

Kiwanis Club of Carbonear Group Rose Bowl Competitions

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> The Group Rose Bowl Competition is divided into two (2) sections; The Choral Group Rose Bowl Competition and The Instrumental Group Rose Bowl Competition. Both have a cash award of \$300 and Rose Bowl replica. Runners-up receive a cash award of \$150 and inscribed shield.

For the purpose of this award, a group shall consist of 13 or more members. Only Choirs and Instrumental Groups competing in Intermediate or Senior classes will qualify.

Competitors for this award will be selected and recommended by the adjudicator. The adjudicator reserves the right not to make a recommendation.

A mark of 85% or higher and a first place finish must be obtained in the competitive session from which the group is recommended.

Competitors recommended to compete for this award will be notified by the Committee at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled time of the Rose Bowl Competition when possible. They will be expected to perform the same selections as they performed in the competitive session from which they were recommended.

The decision of the adjudicators regarding the selection of competitors and the declaration of the winner will be final.

The Choral Competition will be based on **vocal performance only** and the Instrumental Competition will be based on **instrumental performance only**.

THE ABOVE RULES ARE SUBJECT TO REVIEW AND POSSIBLE AMENDMENT BY THE ASSOCIATION AFTER EACH YEAR

Through the generous support of individuals, businesses and organizations, the Kiwanis Club of Carbonear Regional Music Festival is able to offer a number of cash awards. A complete list of donors and awards is printed annually in the Festival Programme.

Procedures, Rules and Regulations - CASH AWARDS

Cash awards are awarded to participants who, in the opinion of the adjudicator, show most promise of future development musically and are not necessarily given to winners of classes.

- 2. Cash awards are awarded at the absolute discretion of the adjudicators.
- 3. Cash awards will be announced at the conclusion of the Festival.

VOCM CARES Scholarship

VOCM CARES is pleased to offer a \$500.00 scholarship to participants of the Festival. It is the hope of KIXX Country that this will enable outstanding young musicians to continue their studies.

Conditions of Award

- l. Award to be open to bona fide residents of Newfoundland and Labrador only.
- 1. Award will be subject to application on a prescribed form to be obtained from the website: **kiwanismusicfestca.wixsite.com/kiwaniscarbonear** and must be accompanied by an official transcript of marks for the last academic grade completed and most current marks received in present year.
- 3. Applicants must include a 250 word essay highlighting the importance of this scholarship to the continuation of their musical studies.
- 4. Applicants must be competitors in the current Annual Kiwanis Music Festival.
- 5. Applications must be received by the Association **2 weeks** before the commencement of the current year's Festival **[postmarked March 11th, 2022]**. Address is: P.O. Box 750, Carbonear, NL A1Y 1C2.
- 6. Award will be made at the discretion of the adjudicator.
- 7. Applicants must be under the age of 25 years.
- 8. Award shall not necessarily be made in any one year.
- 9. Award shall be in the amount of \$500.00.
- 10. Students presently or previously enrolled in advanced music studies at university level are not eligible for this award.

The Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 23 is pleased to offer a scholarship up to \$350, to participants of the Festival. It is the hope of the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 23 that this will enable outstanding young musicians to continue their studies at recognised schools of music.

Conditions of Award

- l. Recipient must be a competitor in the current Annual Kiwanis Music Festival.
- 2. Award will be made at the discretion of the adjudicators.
- 3. Recipient must be under the age of 25 years.
- 4. Award shall not necessarily be made in any one year.
- 5. Award(s) shall be up to the amount of \$350.
- 6. Students presently or previously enrolled in music studies at university level are eligible for this award.

(Other conditions may apply.)

Scotiabank of Carbonear Adjudicator's Choice Awards

Awards are presented at the discretion of the adjudicators. \$300 to be divided between a Solo Vocalist, Pianist and Instrumentalist under age 25 years.

Quin-Sea Fisheries Ltd. Awards

Awards are divided and presented at the discretion of the Adjudicators, solely for encouragement to competitors and not necessarily for best performance. Awards total \$500.

Kiwanis Jubilee Award

This award is in memory of departed members of the Kiwanis Club of Carbonear. \$100 and an inscribed shield for best performance in Junior Concert Group, 12 years and under: Classes 20030, 30030 and 50030.

Procedures, Rules and Regulations - GENERAL

<u>MANAGEMENT</u>

- 1. The participants shall be under the management of the Kiwanis Club of Carbonear Regional Music Festival.
- 2. All matters not dealt with in these rules shall be referred to the Committee, whose decision on such matters shall be final and binding on all concerned.
- 3. The Committee will assume no responsibility for providing facilities for rehearsals.

DEFINITIONS

- 4. For the purpose of these competitions an amateur shall be defined as follows: Any person who, up to the date of closing of entries for the forthcoming festival, has not obtained from the profession or practice of music his/her principal means of livelihood AND/OR has not graduated with a post-secondary degree in Music.
- 5. For the purpose of these competitions a "Folk Song" shall be defined as follows: A song which has been passed down from generation to generation and may have no known composer. Where music is out of print, words and music, even if handwritten by the music teacher, must be submitted to the adjudicator and will be accepted, it may be noted as "arranged by". NL songs belong in a separate class.

ELIGIBILITY

- 6. All competitions, unless otherwise stated, shall be open to amateurs only. Participants in Choral Societies, Choirs, Orchestras, and Bands must be bona fide members of their respective organizations on or before November 12th 2021. Members of Choral Societies, Choirs, Orchestras and Bands may be professionals provided they comply with these membership conditions. Choirs are not permitted to use computerized or taped accompaniment.
- 7. In all Individual, Duet or Trio classes, in which an age limit is prescribed, participants must not be over the prescribed age on **December 31, 2021.** In Choral Groups, Choirs, Bands, Ensembles, or other group entries in which an age limit is prescribed, 90% of the participants must be under the prescribed age as of January l of the year in which the Festival is held. The Association will require the assurance of the director that all members of the group fall within this requirement. However, no member performing in the group is to be more than one year over the prescribed age.
- 8. In the following sections Vocal, Piano and Instrumental corresponding Groups of Classes such as "Open" or Age Groupings, such as "20 years and under", are provided. With those sections, participants in Solo Classes must elect which Group to enter, subject to the age limit specified, and they shall not be eligible to compete in any other Group in the same Section in Solo Classes. Concert Groups are exempt from this restriction.
- 9. In Duet Classes participants must likewise elect which class or age grouping to enter,

based on the age of the oldest participant, and they shall not be eligible to compete in any other duet class. The exception to this rule is CLASS 30880 OPEN (Pupil-Teacher) NON COMPETITIVE. A student MAY enter this class and ONE OTHER in the Duet Classes. A teacher may enter Class 30880 any number of times WITH DIFFERENT STUDENTS. The Student is considered the participant and is adjudicated but the teacher is not adjudicated and is therefore not considered a participant.

In **Lieder Classes**, 00090 to 00130 inclusive, participants must elect which class to enter based on the age of the oldest participant. The same two participants may enter either class a second time providing they perform in the opposite medium, eg: A plays piano and B sings then A sings and B plays piano. They MAY enter any Lieder Class with different partners providing each participant performs **ONLY ONCE** on piano and **ONCE** as the vocalist. **NOTE:** In this class only, the pianist is encouraged to use the Music. This will enhance the performance and will NOT negatively affect adjudication.

- 10. A participant may compete only once in each class, with the above exceptions noted.
- ll. Conductors may be either professional or amateur. Conductors may conduct any number of organizations in the same class or in any number of classes. Conductors must not sing with the Choral Group or Choir, nor play with their Orchestra or Band.
- 12. Classroom Choirs for grades kindergarten, one and two require no stated percentage of the pupils on the classroom register. Singers will be chosen at the discretion of the teacher.
- 13. Classroom Choirs, Grades 3-6, consist of not less than 75% of the pupils on the homeroom register. Where more than one grade is taught in one classroom, the Choir must enter the class provided for the highest grade.
- 14. Classroom Choirs, Grades 7 and 8, entry must consist of 75% of the music class, plus any other pupils in the class wishing to participate (at the teacher's discretion).
- 15. Classroom Choirs, when a class is composed of a mixture of two grades and there are also in that same school, 2 classes containing a class each of both the above grades then the portion of the mixed class of one particular grade can combine with the complete class of that same grade, on a basis of 75% of the total.
- 16. Non-Competitive Classes: Entrants may enter either competitive or non-competitive classes but not both in their age group.
- 17. Choral selections must be performed exactly as written in music provided to adjudicators. Transposed pieces are permitted but MUST be indicated to the adjudicator.

TEST PIECES

18. In Junior Choral and Vocal Classes (18 years and under) transpositions are permitted to enable participants to perform in the most suitable key. Test pieces must be

performed in the prescribed key in all other classes, unless otherwise specified. (e.g. no transposition in Musical Theatre Class 10060). See National Syllabus on website, Class 01081.

19. In Open Vocal Classes test pieces are to be sung in the original language. In all other age groups, language is optional unless otherwise specified.

20. **Repeats:**

- In Brass, Woodwind and String Sections, repeats are to be played where indicated.
- In the Piano Section repeats shall not be played unless specifically stated in the Syllabus. De Capo repeats, however, shall be observed.
- 21. Where a specified edition of a Test Piece (Restricted) is indicated in the Syllabus, a copy thereof will be furnished to the Adjudicator by the Association, and participants are recommended to use this edition.
- 22. No costuming or props except in Musical Theatre **and** Gilbert and Sullivan Classes. Also, no human props in Musical Theatre and Gilbert and Sullivan Classes.
- 23. Photocopying of copyright music for the purpose of performance is illegal. No photocopies, computer-generated copies or copies derived from computer programmes will be allowed in this Festival in any case whatsoever, unless they show legal authorization by the publisher, proof of payment or proof of public domain. Public Domain is not applicable for anything in Musical Theatre.

24. **Memory** is **compulsory** for:

- All Concert Groups
- All Vocal Solo Class pieces
- All piano and instrumental classes for ages 16 and over (with the exception
 of the pianist in the lieder classes 00090 to 00130). If music is used,
 participant will be ineligible for awards.

Memory is **recommended** for piano and instrumental classes for ages 13 and over. The adjudicator has the power to deduct marks from those using sheet music during a performance.

In piano and instrumental classes for ages 12 and under, participants will not be penalized for performing from sheet music, though in the event of a tie, those performing from memory will be deemed of the higher standard.

- 25. In Senior Concert Groups, all participants must announce their name and the pieces they are going to perform.
- 26. In classes in which any test piece is the participant's "own choice" or where a "restricted choice" is indicated, the title, composer and performance time thereof must be specified when registering. For the use of the adjudicator, a publisher's copy (not a photocopy) of such music, bearing the name of the participant and class number,

must be delivered to him/her at the beginning of each performance and claimed immediately after adjudication. **Failure to do so will make the participant ineligible for a mark,** and therefore any award, as the Adjudicator cannot refer to the music for the adjudication. General comments can be provided but no mark.

NOTE: Each piece of music, be it a SET PIECE or OWN SELECTION, can be performed only once by each participant in all classes entered in the Festival.

Participants who select songs other than English, must also file with the copy of the music a translation of the words into English. Failure to comply with these provisions shall render the participants liable to disqualification.

- 27. For instrumental pieces, music must be provided to the adjudicator. <u>Tablature is not permitted.</u>
- 28. Accompanists for test pieces: For Instrumental Classes, where appropriate, **piano accompaniment only is permissible**. An exception is made for the Traditional Fiddling Section Classes where guitar accompaniment is also permitted. For Vocal Classes, only one accompanist is permissible.
- 29. Folk Songs, NL Songs and Pop Songs must be limited to **three verses plus** chorus OR a maximum of 4 minutes. If verses need to be deleted from the selection, this should be noted on the music given to the Adjudicator. **This will be strictly enforced this year.**

Registration and Payment

30. Registration for the 2022 Festival will be online at:

http://carb.musicfestivalsuite.com

Registration opens on **October 10**th, 2021.

Profiles may be created prior to Registration. Music Teachers and Parents must create their Profiles online before the entrants can register. Accompanists need to create a Profile as well. Additional information will be sent to the Music Teachers to distribute to their parents and students.

31. The deadlines are:

November 15th, 2021. Late entries will be accepted until **November 22nd** with a \$10 Late Fee assigned.

- 32. After Registration closes, entries will be scrutinized for errors and a reminder will be sent to Registrants to review your entries. <u>After December 12th, no further changes will be permitted.</u>
- 33. Our software program checks for conflicts in Solo Classes, Duets, Trios and Quartets but we have to check manually for all Group Classes (Bands, Choirs, Ensembles). Those Group classes should be listed in the **Comments** section of the Registration screen when registering the Solo, Duet, Trio, Quartet classes. <u>If those classes on not listed</u>, we cannot check for conflicts between Solo and Group classes and will

- **not be able to accommodate ANY scheduling changes as a result.** We try and accommodate Accompanist conflicts if the accompanist **Profile id** is linked to your Registration, but this may not always be possible.
- 34. It is the responsibility of the competitor to read ALL rules in the Syllabus and enter the correct class by Class Number.
- 35. Entry Fees will be submitted online at the time of Registration. They can only be paid through **PayPal** using a credit card or a PayPal account. Entry fees cannot be refunded, except under circumstances where the entry is refused by the Festival Committee.

36. **Issues to keep in mind when registering:**

- Ensure you are entered in the correct age group. This is based on your age as of December 31st, 2021.
- Entrants may enter either competitive or non-competitive classes but not both in their age group
- Check the spelling of your piece and the ORIGINAL composer
- NL songs should be in the NL Song Classes and **not** the Folk Song Classes
- Remember to enter the Profile ID of your Music Teacher (and Accompanist if applicable) and list any Choirs and Bands in which you are registered.
- Check your fees as Solo Classes, and Concert Group Classes have different fees.

PROGRAMME PROCEDURE

- 37. Immediately following the closing date for entries, the Association shall decide the order in which Classes will be taken, and the system will set the order of participants in such classes. The Association reserves the right to alter the order, if necessary.
- 38. The Association reserves the right to sub-divide any Class(es) into two or more competitions under circumstances where the number or character of the entries would justify sub-division. If any Concert Group classes eligible for the Rose Bowl are split, the highest mark between the split classes will be invited to the Rose Bowl competition. Similarly, if any of the Awards involve a Class that is split, the highest mark between the split classes will receive the award.
- 39. Where there are any number of classes with very few entries, the Association reserves the right to combine some or all such classes together into one or more sessions for performance in the competitive part of the festival. This will mean that each entry performs one after the other regardless of class separation, and are adjudicated "en bloc" after they have all performed. The certificates awarded will, of course, reflect the individual classes in which each entered.
- 40. The Association reserves the right to appoint additional adjudicators.
- 41. All scheduling information will be available online to the Music Teachers, Parents and entrants.. The Association reserves the right to disqualify any participant who is not ready to compete when called.

- 42. Participants must play or sing in the order of competition indicated in the Programme. The Association reserves the right to change the order for participants from distant points in the event of transportation difficulties or where special circumstances warrant. In the event of illness, accident or other emergency, a substitute may be made in all duet, trio, quartet classes, or any group classes, provided the Festival Coordinator is notified and given the reason for substitution prior to the time set for performance, and provided the substitute is eligible under the Rules and Regulations governing such class.
- 43. In each competition where in the music performed by a candidate is designated as "Own Choice", each candidate will be adjudicated at the level or grade at which he or she is studying, and hence performing, at the time of the festival. This includes "Concert Group" classes.
- 44. In each competition wherein music by title is printed in the official festival programme, the same music, and if more than one selection is to be played, the same order as submitted by the candidate on the official festival entry form, must be employed. **No** changes can be made in the music itself **or** in the order of the performance of the music after on-line registration. This includes "Concert Groups".
- 45. The order of competition will not be changed to accommodate the accompanists. If the accompanist is entered in the on-line registration, we will try and accommodate.
- 46. The chord may be given on the piano at the commencement of each piece of unaccompanied music.
- 47. In String Classes for Juniors, participants may have their instruments tuned by a teacher or other person. In Brass and Woodwind Classes, instruments may be tuned before performance.
- 48. The adjudicator shall have discretionary power to stop any performance at any time.
- 49. The decisions made by the Adjudicators as to first, second and third places, awards, marks and recommendations are final, as are all the decisions made by the adjudicators regarding which entrants will be asked to perform in one or more of the Festival Concerts. [See Rule #58]
- 50.. **Absolute Silence** must be observed while the competitions are in progress. This also includes the time needed to complete the written as well as verbal adjudication. Also, <u>flash photography, camcorder with lights and other recording devices WILL NOT be permitted during the performance.</u> Due to copyright laws, there shall be no recording the verbal adjudication.
- 51. **Adequate Supervision** is required for all groups participating in the Festival. This should include the group director plus responsible adults on a ratio of up to 25 students to one adult.
- 52. At no time are the directors, teachers or parents of participants to speak with Page 13

the adjudicators before the conclusion of the Rose Bowl competitions.

AWARDS

- 53. At the conclusion of each Class, participants will be furnished with their adjudicator's report unless such report must be retained for subsequent use by the committee; such retained reports will be forwarded to the participant on request and on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope. The request must list participant's name and class number.
- 54. Certificates will be awarded to the three participants gaining the highest marks in each class, but no certificate will be awarded unless the following percentage of the possible marks has been obtained:
 - (a) Average in Choral, Orchestral and Band Classes (equivalent of 75%)
 - (b) Good in all other classes (equivalent of 80%)
- 55. In those Classes for which Awards, Trophies or Plaques have been provided, 85% of the possible marks shall be necessary to obtain such Award, Trophy or Plaque.
- 56. Where groups of the Classes are involved in a particular Award that is Adjudicator's Choice, the winner of that Award will be determined by the Adjudicator and will not necessarily go to the highest mark in the group of Classes.
- 57. Trophies and Cash Awards will be presented at the time decided upon by the Association.

GRAND CONCERTS

58. Any participant is eligible to be called upon to perform at the Grand Concerts. This shall be without remuneration or payment for incidental expenses. **Invitations are based on recommendations by the adjudicators and at the discretion of the Committee.**

COMPLAINTS AND PROTESTS

59. Complaints and protests must be made directly to the Festival Coordinator in writing during the Festival and NOT to the Adjudicator. Such complaint or protest must be accompanied by a fee equivalent to the entry fee of the Class protested.
